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REACHING HIGHER GOALS BUILDING NEWER COLLABORATIONS



In the year 2018, ISRN has ventured into new horizons thereby serving the society in better ways than before. We take this opportunity to take you on a wonderful journey of our dynamic year.

We are extremely thankful to all our members and partners for helping us reach our goals and inspiring us to aim even higher in coming years.



With the commencement of Phase I of the Healthcare initiative namely "Swasth Suvidhayein Apke Dwar" in February 2018, ISRN along with Rambhau Mhalgi Prabodhini (RMP) catered to the varied medical needs of the underserved community in 10 locations in Khora, Ghaziabad. The Phase II of the initiative was supported by Indraprastha Gas Limited (IGL) covering 12 locations in Bagu, Ghaziabad, U.P.

Around 25,000 beneficiaries were provided with free of cost medicines, lab tests, preventive, promotive and curative counselling through specialised Health Camps & daily check-ups by the doctor. The core of the program is a Mobile Health Unit that serves as a hospital on wheels travelling to different locations and serving the deprived.



ISRN supported Jamia Hamdard in organizing an International Conference namely "Changed Social Responsibility: Mutually Inclusive and Exclusive" as a Knowledge Partner. The conference gave an excellent opportunity to the participants to envisage their horizons on mindboggling issues like "Development Initiatives through NGOs", "Effects of CSR Activities on Social Capital Creation" and "How are Educational Institutes Making their Presence felt in the Development Sector".



"Digital Health Governance: Improving Lives through Connected Healthcare" a Policy Dialogue was conducted by ISRN in collaboration with "Prasana School of Public Health" in New Delhi. The salient features of the program includes discussions on "Innovation for Health" along with "Country Perspectives" wherein stories from all over the world were echoed and equally imbibed by a zealous audience. The Policy Dialogue was attended by 112 participants from India and across the globe comprising of Global Changemakers, Policy implementers, Public Policy Experts, Healthcare Experts, Innovators, Academia, NGOs, Governance Experts etc.



Working towards better implementation of Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) scheme, ISRN in collaboration with Centre for Digital Financial Inclusion (CDFI) undertook a baseline survey in the districts of Mandsaur and Neemuch in Madhya Pradesh for curating a Village Development Plan towards better implementation of Government Policies and Programs.



ISRN conducted a One-day Orientation Program on Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) for building capacities of Secretaries of MPs for the better implementation of the scheme to make it more effective. The program was attended by 65 officials who participated in the engaging discussions.

Under the study titled "Documentation and Compilation of Antyodaya Based Best Practices as propounded by Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay", ISRN with the support of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India has embarked on a special journey to highlight the Best Practices of the Unsung heroes who are working silently for the last man amongst the deprived.



"ISRN Antyodaya Fellowship Program" has been started with an aim to hone the research skills of aspiring researchers who participated from all over the nation, requiring them to meet the heroes of the field, and collect more information about their philanthropic and benign work that has brought change in the lives of the isolated and deprived people of our society.



The young and enthusiastic fellows selected to carry out the validation met overly cooperative and zealous representatives of the designated NGOs who left no stone unturned in furnishing all the material information our fellows required.

The field visit to the areas where the project were executed, gave a life time golden opportunity to the fellows to meet the real beneficiaries of the programs. The sparkling eyes, shining faces and contentment in their words vindicated the good work NGO has done to uplift the last person of the society.

Our fellows are still in the fields, doing their job ardently and sincerely, searching for stories which have truly proved to be the change maker with the help of revolutionized and "out of the box" ideas. They are in search of those ideas which are feasible and can give same results if implemented somewhere else.

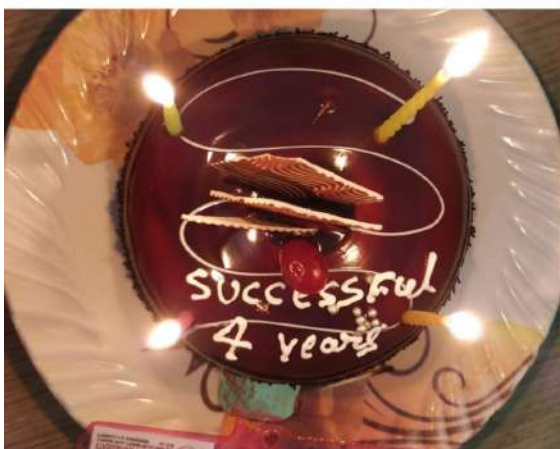


Over the year as a part of Uttam School model several Software and Hardware Training programs were organised in Jawad, Madhya Pradesh. The programs were organised with the aim to make teachers equipped to conduct smart classes with the help of smart board and E-Content. More than 50 teachers from 29 Government schools of Jawad participated in these trainings over the period, with the aim to make their lessons more effective.
